- Deputy Mayor Street attended the Northeast Avalon Joint Council Year End and AGM last Thursday. She noted that she has been the co-chair on the committee for a year and considered it a privilege to work with 15 other Municipalities discussing items that are important and sharing best practices with each other.
- Deputy Mayor Street brought greetings at Neveah's Lemonade Stand on Saturday where over \$65,000 was raised to help children fight pediatric cancer with assisting with travel costs, accommodation and meals. This was an incredible celebration in memory of Neveah Denine and Deputy Mayor Street thanked Town Staff and Neveah's Angel Foundation.
- Deputy Mayor Street brought greetings at the Recreation Around the World Event on June 14 at Peter Barry Duff Memorial Park. She stated that it was a beautiful day and that the event was well-attended.
- Deputy Mayor Street attended the Seniors Year End Dinner last Saturday night and brought greetings on behalf of the Town. It was a great event with wonderful conversation and a great meal by Pat and Sue. The 50+ Adventure Club thanked the Town for all their support and look forward to seeing everyone again in September.
- Deputy Mayor Street had the privilege of bringing greetings and starting the 97th Annual Tely 10 Road Race. She thanked the volunteers, the organizers, the supporters and the Public Works Staff.
- Councillor Martin recognized resident Levi Moulton on winning the Tely 10. He also congratulated Kate Bazeley for being the top female winner at the Tely 10 and setting a new time of 53:42 which is very impressive.
- Councillor Carew reminded residents to be watchful of children on the trails and the roadways as they will be out and about more as they finish school on Thursday.

- Councillor Vaters congratulated everyone graduating from Grade 12 outside our Municipality. He noted that in a couple of years we will hopefully be having students graduating out of our own High School.
- Councillor Vaters attended the Tely 10 opening on Sunday morning but couldn't attend the Saturday Events as he was at the Atlantic Mayors Congress in Saint John, New Brunswick on behalf of the Town. There were great discussions at this event and information provided on a number of topics including economic development and prosperity, Canada/US relations and advocacy and collaboration. Councillor Vaters noted that he has been fortunate during this term of Council to attend several regional, provincial and national meetings such as FCM, MNL, the Eastern Regional Services Board and the Northeast Avalon Joint Council where the knowledge acquired is truly immeasurable and beneficial for helping residents navigate issues, they want Council to help them with. He noted that along with the knowledge obtained it's the connections you make, the networking and the ability to learn how other Municipalities deal with similar issues. Councillor Vaters stated that attending these meetings is an opportunity to enhance already acquired skills in relationship building, decision making, social responsibility and financial accountability which are all essential to serving in different capacities, whether its being a committee or council lead, being a chair or vice chair of a national committee or aspiring to other roles on council, Deputy Mayor or Mayor.
